



FORMULA VEE AUSTRALIAN SERIES 2018

SERIES REGULATIONS

Dates for the series are:

QLD	Lakeside	7-8 April
SA	Tailem Bend	9-10 June
NSW	Sydney Motorsports Park	30 June – 1 July
WA	Barbagallo	15-16 September

The series will be known as the **Formula Vee Australian Series 2018**.

Competition will be held National Competition Rules (NCRs) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport (CAMS), the Race Meeting Standing Regulations of CAMS and Supplementary Regulations of the relevant race meetings. Competing cars must conform to the rules for Formula Vee defined in the CAMS manual current for the year of competition and any subsequent bulletins as issued by CAMS.

There is no registration fee for the series but to score points a competitor must be a current financial member of a state Formula Vee Association at the date of competition and present a membership card upon request. Trophies will be provided by FVAA.

Competition will be in two classes:

- 1600 class (open to 1600 class cars as defined in Formula Vee regulations)
- 1200 class (open to 1200 class cars as defined in Formula Vee regulations).

Although four rounds are nominated, points for races in only three rounds will be counted. That is, for race points, one round (the worst round) is dropped. Race points allocation for each class being as follows:

All other finishers 1 point.

In the event that there are more than three races at any round only the first three races will count for points for both series and round results.

In the event of a dead-heat on points in either a round or the series, results will be determined on count-back of best finishing positions and if still equal on qualifying times.

Trophies for each round will be awarded to first, second and third in each class based on aggregate points won at that round and provided there is not less than five competitors in that class in which case only first place will receive a trophy.

Trophies for the series overall will be awarded to first, second and third in each class based on aggregate points as defined above.

The winner of the series in the preceding year in the 1600 class shall be entitled to use the number 1 plate for the series only in the following year. Winner of the series shall not be entitled to use the number 1 plate for the Formula Vee National Challenge unless it is the same person.

The National Technical Director, either personally or by delegation, must oversee eligibility scrutineering of competing cars as he deems appropriate. Any irregularities are to be reported to the CAMS Chief Scrutineer and subsequently managed through the CAMS judicial process.
